


The Sunday Times Digital Archive is a part of the Gale NewsVault programme.

The Sunday Times Digital Archive enables users to search, retrieve and browse articles from the complete run of this historic newspaper. With nearly 600,000 pages, The Sunday Times Digital Archive is a gateway to the greatest crimes, careers and culture of the last 180 years.

About The Sunday Times

Since 1822, The Sunday Times has provided thoughtful analysis and commentary on the week's news and society at large. Murder, theatre, sport and politics – all collide in its pages in an abundance of glorious narrative detail. World-famous for its cutting-edge investigative journalism, the newspaper broke many of the key stories of the twentieth century, including the thalidomide scandal in the 1960s, the exposure of Kim Philby as a Soviet double-agent, and the revelations about the Israeli nuclear program in 1986.

Despite the similarity of names, *The Sunday Times* was an entirely separate paper from *The Times* until 1966, when both papers came under common ownership. To this day, *The Sunday Times* remains editorially independent from *The Times*, with its own remit and perspective on the news.





History and Culture

From major world and British events to stories of everyday life in the 19th and 20th centuries, the paper has always aimed to publish all the news that is fit to print.



Theatre

From the very first issue, *The Sunday Times* had a dedicated theatre correspondent, reporting on the latest London shows. Praise, criticism and gossip mingled in its regular arts column for over 180 years.



From its early days as a 4-page paper, crammed with columns of narrow text, through to its current incarnation as a modern, illustrated broadsheet, The Sunday Times is the archetypal weekly newspaper – an ideal subject for studying the evolution of the press.



Literature

Poetry and reviews of new books have been a key feature of The Sunday Times since its inception. Predating the TLS by 80 years, the 19th century The Sunday Times reviewed and commented on many classic works of the Victorian period, as well as many that are now long-forgotten.



Family History

The newspaper has featured a regular births, deaths and marriages column throughout its lifespan, making it an excellent resource for family lifespan research. In the nineteenth century the paper even included a regular Freemasonry column, as well as publishing details of the graduates from Sandhurst.
