**NOTE:** In view of the potential for variants in personal names, the *Middle Eastern Literatures and Their Times* index has provided an aid to the reader's further research by giving the full Library of Congress (LC) form of a name. Where common usage differs from the LC form, the index uses the common form followed by the full LC form in parenthesis, e.g. Gemayel, Bashir (LC: Jumayyil, Bashir). Names beginning with the prefix *al-* (meaning "the") are alphabetized under the letter following the prefix (e.g., for al-Jahiz, look under Jahiz).
