The *Fine Art Collection* is available in the same easy-to-use interface as the *Historical Collection*. Movement between the collections is seamless and can be easily managed via a dropdown menu. The content in both products can be explored using the Galleries browse, Keyword Search and Advanced Search options.

As with the *Historical Collection*, images in the *Fine Art Collection* can be accessed via a secure Web site that allows authorized users to easily search and download images from an on-premise terminal or via remote IP-based authentication. Images can be downloaded in 1280 pixel resolution.

Where can you find many of the most famous photographs in history, including images of the tragedy of the Hindenburg explosion and the daring flights of the Wright Brothers?
