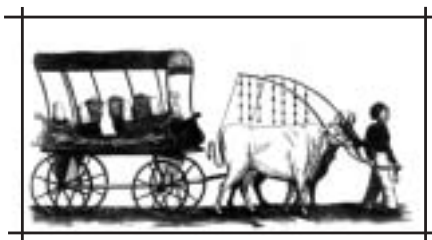

### Exploring the Middle East

*Western Books: The Middle East from the Rise of Islam* illuminates more than the historical development of the Middle East. The materials are of compelling interest to social and cultural historians, geographers and anthropologists, as well as those working in several other disciplines, such as art and design, architecture, theology, linguistics and economics. More than half of the titles included in this unique archive are printed in English, with the remainder available in other Western languages, including French, German, Italian and Spanish.

*Western Books: The Middle East from the Rise of Islam* is made more valuable by the inclusion of a large number of books illustrated with photographs, engravings, maps and other visually descriptive materials. As a result, researchers enjoy a rich, detailed presentation of the cultural, environmental and societal context.

Featured here are memoirs, travel literature, biographical and bibliographical material, guide books, historical studies and texts and works in translation from regional languages, such as legal texts, chronicles and collected letters.

This significant collection is also a key source of insight into how European writers and observers perceived and represented the people and the cultures of the Middle East. The materials focus on the role of cultural stereotypes in the substance and direction of European/American relations with the Middle East beginning in the 18th century. In addition, *Western Books: The Middle East from the Rise of Islam* provides material for the exploration of how contemporary views and perceptions are shaped by the distant past.
